

Family Promise of Monmouth County Statistics of Operations as of December 31, 2011

In 2011 Family Promise of Monmouth County served 18 families. They included 24 adults and 37 children, totaling 61 individuals.

Of the 37 children we served, 17 (46%) were age five or younger.

We provided 3388 (up from 3260 in 2010) bed nights. Our average length of stay was 54 days (down from 65 days in 2010).

Thirteen of the eighteen families were headed by single parents (9 single mothers, two single dads, two single grandmothers raising their grandchildren.) We had five two parent families.

Fifty seven percent of the families we served were African American, 38% were Caucasian, 5% were Hispanic.

All Eighteen families were from Monmouth County at intake.

Five families secured permanent housing at discharge, four went into transitional housing programs, five moved in with family or friends, one's housing status at discharge was unknown and three were still in the network at year end.

Twelve of our families became homeless because of eviction or foreclosure, four become homeless because of displacement (overcrowding, flood, fire etc.) and two become homeless because of family conflict.

Six parents in our families were employed at discharge, three were collecting unemployment, three were receiving welfare benefits, two were receiving social security benefits, and one had no income at discharge.

Three families were employed upon entering the network and five secured employment while in the network.

Seven families participated in our after-care program (Family Pride) and three families participated in the Step-Up program (provides single parents with job training and education for independent living for up to two years after graduation).

We provided 130 case management sessions in 2011.

Since we opened in 2001 we have served 163 families totaling 488 individuals, which consisted of 209 adults and 279 children.
